The trucking industry is facing a massive driver shortage that's affecting the movement of commerce in our country. Estimates show trucking companies will need to hire an additional 890,000 drivers over the next decade. The **DRIVE-Safe Act** (S. 659, H.R. 1745) creates a pathway to both qualify more drivers for the trucking profession and instill a culture of safety.

DRIVE-SAFE ACT

- ✓ 18 years old
- ✓ Pass a written exam
- ✓ Pass a driver's test
- ✓ Driver can make a **744 mile trip** from Houston to El Paso, Texas.
- ✗ Cannot cross state lines. Making a **14 mile trip** from Washington D.C. to Springfield, Virginia illegal.

- ✓ 18 years old
- ✓ Pass a written exam
- ✓ Pass a driver's test
- ✓ Log **400 hours of on-duty training**
- ✓ Log **240 hours of driving time with an experienced driver in the cab**
- ✓ Trucks used for training must be equipped with safety technology:
 - ✓ Active braking collision mitigation systems,
 - ✓ Video event capture, and
 - ✓ Speed governor set at 65 miles per hour or below
- ✓ Driver can participate in interstate commerce, upon successful completion of the training.
- ✓ Driver is able to make a **14 mile trip** from Washington D.C. to Springfield, Virginia.
